

July begins a new appointment in GNJ, and many congregations are now navigating a transition. In this second week of July, the first worship service for new appointments is in the rear-view mirror; yet the work of transition for the pastor and congregation is still happening. While many new pastors will meet with the small groups in their congregations during the time of transition, I would suggest you set up a meeting with the small group leaders to engage in some meaningful conversation.

Here are some questions to lead the conversation:

Questions for the pastor

From your perspective as a pastor, why do we have small-group ministry?

What is your desire for our small-group ministry?

In your mind, what will successful small-group ministry in our church look like in 1 year, 3 years?

How will I know the small-group ministry is successful in your eyes?

What do you need of me as a Small Group Leader?

How often would you like me to communicate with you about small-group ministry progress?

Questions for the Small Group Leaders:

What are your favorite small group studies/programs?

How do you as a leader recruit new group members?

Are there any group strategies or approaches that have worked well in our context?

Are there any group strategies or approaches that you believe have not worked in our context?

Does our church need or want a small-group ministry that grows quickly or one that grows steadily?

What is the next important step for Small Group Ministry?
