



Dear Pastor,

Greetings in Christ:

History reminds us that in the segregated Delaware Conference, pastors were recruited and nurtured from the Methodist Youth Fellowship. The senior pastor would see a special holy spark emanating from a particular youth. The youth would become an apprentice under the leadership of the senior pastor. This process was often referred to as the “Home-Grown” recruiting from within the congregation. These youth would be nurtured by the elder and the church to become effective future pastoral leaders and preachers. The church provided educational support for college and seminary. There was a sense of pride and joy on the part of the congregation to see one of their own become ordained as elder. It is our intention to bring back this “Home-Grown” process for cultivating new exceptional young Elders of African Descent for the GNJUMC.

The purpose of this program is to create a special recruitment program for youth and young adults of African Descent to help them discern and clarify their call to ministry. The goal is to cultivate within each person pastoral skills to grow into an exceptional future leader in GNJ churches and to create within these persons a strong sense of ministry excellence.

We are seeking recommendations for the GNJUMC *Internship for Young People of African Descent*. We are asking pastors of local churches to identify and recommend youth and/or young adults (between the ages of 16-25) that they believe possessed the gifts for ministry, as demonstrated by their current work in the church, to be considered for this program.

The *Internship for Young People of African Descent* will begin July 1, 2022, and end June 30, 2023. The applicant will go through a selection process before acceptance to the program. If accepted, the students/interns will be expected to work 20 hours a week including Sundays.

Please complete the attached application if you have a youth and/or young adult of African Descent for Order of Elder who has been identified as having a call to ministry.

Submit the application no later than March 15, 2022

Note: Applicants must be affirmed by the SPRC.

Intern that you recommend may not be assigned to your church.
